1 Relating to the Alaska advance college tuition payment fund; and providing for an
2 effective date.

6 * Section 1. AS 09.38.015(a) is amended to read:

7 (a) An individual is entitled to exemption of the following property:

8 (1) a burial plot for the individual and the individual's family;

9 (2) health aids reasonably necessary to enable the individual or a dependent to
10 work or to sustain health;

11 (3) benefits paid or payable for medical, surgical, or hospital care to the extent
12 they are or will be used to pay for the care;

13 (4) an award under AS 18.67 (Violent Crimes Compensation Board) or a crime
14 victim's reparations act of another jurisdiction;

15 (5) benefits paid or payable as a longevity bonus under AS 47.45;

16 (6) compensation or benefits paid or payable and exempt under federal law;

17 (7) liquor licenses granted under AS 04;

18 (8) limited entry permits granted under AS 16.43, except as provided in that
19 chapter;

20 (9) tuition credits under an advance college tuition payment contract
21 authorized under AS 14.40.809(a).

1 * Sec. 2. AS 14.40.803 is amended to read:

2 Sec. 14.40.803. ALASKA ADVANCE COLLEGE TUITION PAYMENT
3 [EDUCATION TRUST] FUND ESTABLISHED. (a) The Alaska advance college tuition
4 payment [EDUCATION TRUST] fund is established as a nonlapsing [AN ENDOWMENT
5 TRUST] fund of the University of Alaska. The fund is established for the purpose of
6 enhancing the ability of the university to provide (1) higher education for the people of the
7 state; (2) wide and affordable access to higher education for residents and their children;
8 (3) an incentive for residents to achieve higher academic standards in grades 7 - 12; and
9 (4) an incentive for residents to continue and complete secondary and post secondary
10 education [SEPARATE FROM THE GENERAL FUND]. The fund may be divided into
11 separate accounts for accounting purposes.

12 (b) The fund consists of

13 (1) permanent fund dividend and cash contributions made under AS 14.40.807
14 under the terms of an advance tuition payment contract;

15 (2) appropriations, gifts, bequests, and contributions of cash or other assets
16 [FROM A PERSON]; and

17 (3) income and earnings of the fund.

18 (c) Assets of the fund shall be expended [IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER OF
19 PRIORITY:

20 (1) to make payments to the university, including payments for [ON BEHALF
21 OF QUALIFIED BENEFICIARIES;

22 (2) TO MAKE] refunds, redemptions, and awards under [UPON
23 TERMINATION OF] an advance tuition payment contract or a prepaid tuition scholarship, and
24 [;

25 (3) TO PAY THE] costs of administration of the fund.

27 Sec. 14.40.805. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE.
28 The commissioner of revenue is the custodian [TRUSTEE] of the fund and has the powers and
29 duties under this section to

30 (1) act as official custodian [TRUSTEE] of the cash and investments belonging

1 to the fund and to secure adequate and safe custodial facilities;

2 (2) receive all items of cash and investments belonging to the fund;

3 (3) collect and deposit the principal and income from investments of
4 [ACQUIRED BY THE TRUSTEE AND DEPOSIT THE AMOUNTS IN SEPARATE
5 PRINCIPAL AND INCOME ACCOUNTS FOR] the fund;

6 (4) invest and reinvest the assets of the fund as provided in this section and in
7 accordance with investment objectives, criteria, and asset allocation guidelines established
8 by the board [AS PROVIDED FOR THE INVESTMENT OF RETIREMENT FUNDS UNDER
9 AS 14.25.180];

10 (5) exercise the powers of a custodian [TRUSTEE] with respect to the assets of
11 the fund;

12 (6) do all acts, whether or not expressly authorized, that the commissioner of
13 revenue considers necessary or proper in administering, as a custodian [TRUSTEE], the assets
14 of the fund;

15 (7) maintain accounting records of the fund in accordance with investment
16 accounting principles [AND WITH DISTINCTION BETWEEN THE PRINCIPAL AND
17 INCOME ACCOUNTS OF THE FUND];

18 (8) engage an independent firm of certified public accountants to [ANNUALLY]
19 audit the financial condition of the fund's investments and investment transactions;

20 (9) enter into and enforce contracts or agreements considered necessary for the
21 investment purposes of the fund, including the use of investment managers, consultants, and
22 other custodians of the fund;

23 (10) report to the university the condition and investment performance of the
24 fund;

25 (11) make payments to the university as requested by the board, including
26 payments for [ON BEHALF OF QUALIFIED BENEFICIARIES;

27 (12) MAKE] refunds and redemptions under [UPON TERMINATION OF] an
28 advance tuition payment contract or a prepaid tuition scholarship,]; and

Chapter 61

1 (a) Contributions to the fund under the terms of an advance tuition payment contract
2 may be made by direct cash payments or by contributions from the permanent fund dividend.

3 The Department of Revenue shall

4 (1) prepare the permanent fund dividend application to allow an applicant [,] or
5 a parent, legal guardian, or other authorized representative of an applicant who is an
6 unemancipated minor to contribute 50 percent of a dividend to the fund under the terms of an
7 advance tuition payment contract; and

8 (2) include with each application for a permanent fund dividend an explanation
9 of the advanced tuition payment program [TRUST FUND], including the right [OF A
10 PURCHASER] to receive a refund, a disclosure of the potential [UPON TERMINATION OF
11 AN ADVANCE TUITION PAYMENT CONTRACT, AND A STATEMENT THAT THE] tax
12 liability of the fund, and disclosure of the possible general effect of the tax liability on the
13 advance college tuition payment program [HAS NOT YET BEEN DETERMINED; AFTER
14 THE INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE DETERMINES THE TAX LIABILITY OF THE
15 FUND, A STATEMENT SUMMARIZING THE TAX DETERMINATION SHALL BE
16 INCLUDED WITH EACH APPLICATION FOR A PERMANENT FUND DIVIDEND].

17 * Sec. 5. AS 14.40.807 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

18 (c) In order to assure the actuarial soundness of the fund, the legislature may appropriate
19 annually to the fund the sum, certified by the board to the governor and the legislature, that is
20 necessary to restore the fund to an amount that is actuarially sound. The board annually, before
21 January 30, shall make and deliver to the governor and to the legislature a certificate stating the
22 sum required to restore the fund to an amount that is actuarially sound, and that sum may be
23 appropriated and paid to the fund during that fiscal year. This subsection does not create a debt
24 or liability of the state.

26 Sec. 14.40.809. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA. (a)
27 The Board of Regents of the University of Alaska may contract with a purchaser for the advance
28 payment of tuition by the purchaser for a [QUALIFIED] beneficiary of any age to attend a
29 branch of the university to which the [QUALIFIED] beneficiary is admitted [, WITHOUT
30 FURTHER TUITION COST TO THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY]. A purchaser and a

1 [QUALIFIED] beneficiary may be the same person.

2 (b) The board shall

3 (1) make appropriate arrangements as necessary to fulfill the board's obligations
4 under an advance tuition payment contract;

5 (2) establish and adopt a formal plan for administration of the advance
6 college tuition payment program and prepaid tuition scholarship program [STANDARD
7 PAYMENT PLANS TO BE USED UNDER ADVANCE TUITION PAYMENT CONTRACTS];

8 (3) establish investment objectives, criteria, and asset allocation guidelines for
9 the fund based on prudent institutional investor guidelines and actuarial analysis of the
10 earnings requirements for the advance college tuition payment plan;

11 (4) enter into a reciprocal agreement with Sheldon Jackson College and
12 Alaska Pacific University; and

13 (5) make the obligation under an advance college tuition payment program
14 a general obligation of the university [THE CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH AN
15 ADVANCE TUITION PAYMENT CONTRACT MAY BE TERMINATED AND THE
16 AMOUNT OF THE REFUND THE PERSON ENTITLED TO TERMINATE THE CONTRACT
17 MAY RECEIVE].

19 Sec. 14.40.811. ADVANCE COLLEGE TUITION PAYMENT CONTRACTS. (a) An
20 advance college tuition payment contract must set out or include by reference to the plan

21 (1) if an installment purchase program is established by the board, the amount
22 of payments required from the purchaser, [ON BEHALF OF THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY;

23 (2)] the terms and conditions for making the payments, and [;

24 (3)] provisions for late payment charges [AND FOR DEFAULT];

25 (2) [(4)] the name and age of the primary and alternate beneficiaries
26 [QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY] under the contract [AND A STATEMENT THAT THE
27 PURCHASER, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD, MAY SUBSTITUTE ANOTHER
28 PERSON FOR THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY ORIGINALLY NAMED IN THE
29 CONTRACT];

30 (3) [(5)] the number of tuition credits [CREDIT HOURS] to be provided to the

1 primary and alternate beneficiaries [QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY] under the contract;
2 (4) [(6) THE NAME OF THE PERSONS ENTITLED TO TERMINATE THE
3 CONTRACT,] the terms and conditions under which the contract may be terminated and refunds
4 made [, AND THE AMOUNT OF THE REFUND TO WHICH THE PERSON TERMINATING
5 THE CONTRACT IS ENTITLED];

6 (5) [(7) the assumption of a contractual obligation by the board to provide tuition
7 credits for [CREDIT HOURS OF] higher education to the beneficiary [AT THE
8 UNIVERSITY];

9 (6) [(8) THE NUMBER OF CREDIT HOURS THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY
10 MAY RECEIVE IF THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY IS NOT ENTITLED TO IN-STATE
11 TUITION AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT AT THE UNIVERSITY];

12 (9) the period of time during which the [QUALIFIED] beneficiary may receive
13 the benefits of the contract; and

14 (7) [(10)] other terms and conditions the board determines to be appropriate.

15 (b) An advance college tuition payment contract may be terminated

16 (1) [IF THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY DIES OR BECOMES SO DISABLED
17 THAT THE BENEFICIARY CANNOT COMPLETE AN EDUCATION];

18 (2) IF THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY IS NOT ADMITTED TO A BRANCH
19 OF THE UNIVERSITY AFTER MAKING A PROPER APPLICATION;

20 (3) IF THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY CERTIFIES TO THE BOARD, AFTER
21 THE CONTRACTED DATE OF ENTRANCE TO THE UNIVERSITY OR AFTER THE
22 QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY HAS RECEIVED A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA OR REACHED
23 THE AGE OF MAJORITY, THAT THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY HAS DECIDED NOT
24 TO ATTEND THE UNIVERSITY;

25 (4) if the board determines that the number of purchasers is insufficient to
26 maintain the fund on an actuarially sound basis; or

27 (2) [(5)] under other circumstances determined by the board and set out in the
28 advance tuition payment contract or in the plan.

30 Sec. 14.40.817. DEFINITIONS. In AS 14.40.803 - 14.40.817,

1 (1) "advance college tuition payment contract" means a contract entered into by
2 the board and a purchaser to provide for the higher education of a [QUALIFIED] beneficiary;

3 (2) "beneficiary" means a person who has rights under an advance college
4 tuition payment contract and who is

5 (A) a resident or who will be a resident before receiving benefits
6 under an advance college tuition payment contract; or

7 (B) a child or legal ward of a resident or of an alumnus of the
8 university;

9 (3) "board" means the Board of Regents of the university;

10 (4) [(3)] "fund" means the Alaska advance college tuition payment
11 [EDUCATION TRUST] fund established under AS 14.40.803;

12 (5) "plan" means the formal plan for administration of an advance college
13 tuition payment program and prepaid tuition scholarship program adopted by the board
14 under AS 14.40.809(b);

15 (6) [(4)] "purchaser" means a person who makes or is obligated to make advance
16 tuition payments under an advance college tuition payment contract;

17 (7) [(5)] "QUALIFIED BENEFICIARY" MEANS A RESIDENT WHO HAS
18 RIGHTS UNDER AN ADVANCE TUITION PAYMENT CONTRACT;

19 (6) "university" means the University of Alaska, including a community college
20 affiliated with the university.
