

Pursuant to AS 24.60, I am disclosing the receipt of two gifts of travel and hospitality, each of which exceeded \$100.

As the former state ombudsman (1981 - 1986), at the invitation of the current ombudsman, Duncan C. Fowler, I attended the annual staff meeting of the Office of the Ombudsman on June 25 to participate in a presentation to the current staff of that office. The Office of the Ombudsman reimbursed me for round trip air fare between Juneau and Anchorage (\$288) and one day's per diem. The office is an entity within the legislative branch; this division has made itself available to consult with staff of the office in conjunction with the completion of the office's investigations.

As the former city manager of Barrow at the time of the incorporation of the North Slope Borough in July, 1972, at the invitation of the mayor and assembly of that municipality, I attended the proceedings marking the twentieth anniversary celebration of the Borough's incorporation (June 30 - July 3, 1992) and, while there, received one of the Borough's Heritage Awards. On my behalf, the North Slope Borough paid the round trip air fare between Juneau and Barrow (\$1094) and the costs of my lodging while in Barrow.
