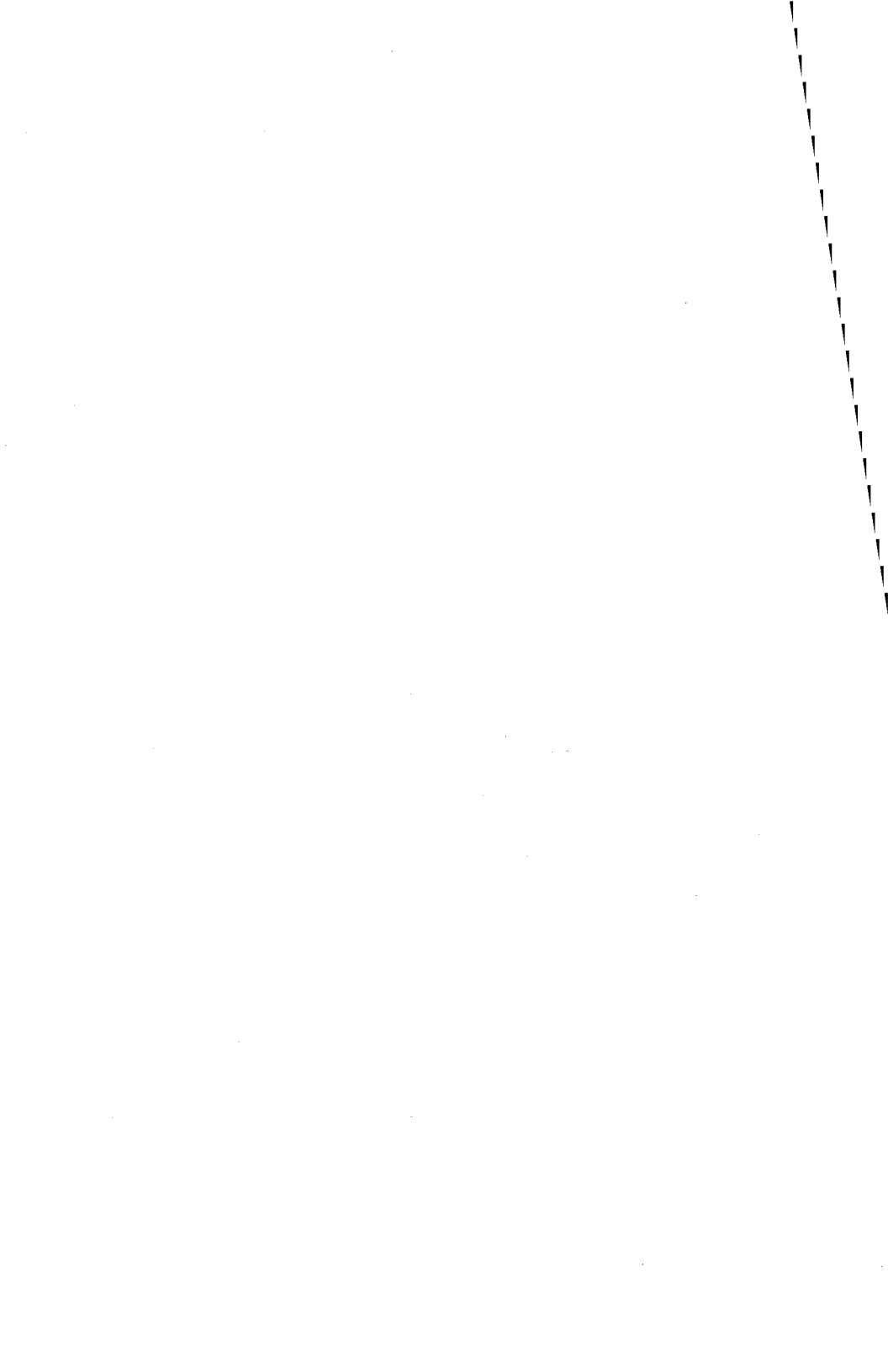

REPORTING FORM
for
Disclosure of the Existence of a Close Economic Association

The Legislative Ethics Law requires legislators and legislative employees to disclose their close economic associations with supervisors, legislators, public officials (other than appointed municipal officials) who must file Conflict of Interest Statements with the APOC, registered lobbyists and, if the discloser is a legislator, with legislative employees. Disclosure of a close economic association that exists on January 1 of the current year must be received by the Ethics Committee by February 15. If a legislator or legislative employee forms a close economic association after January 1, the association must be reported within thirty days, or by February 15, whichever is later. A disclosure must be sufficiently detailed that a reader can ascertain the nature of the association.

"Close economic association" means a financial relationship that exists between a person covered by this chapter and some other person or entity, including but not limited to relationships where the person covered by this chapter serves as a consultant or advisor to, is a member or representative of, or has a financial interest in, any association, partnership, business, or corporation.


