**A BILL**

**FOR AN ACT ENTITLED**

1 "An Act relating to certain licenses and applications for licenses for persons who  
2 are not in substantial compliance with orders, judgments, or payment schedules  
3 for child support; relating to the duty to support children of minor parents;  
4 relating to the program of aid to families with dependent children, including the  
5 payment of aid in the case of pregnant minors and minors who are parents;  
6 proposing special demonstration projects within the program of aid to families  
7 with dependent children and directing the Department of Health and Social  
8 Services to seek waivers from the federal government to implement the projects;  
9 amending Alaska Rule of Civil Procedure 90.3."

10 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

11 \* **Section 1.** AS 25.27.060 is amended by adding new subsections to read:

12 (e) If the child's parents are both unmarried minors who have not had the

1 disabilities of minority removed under AS 09.55.590, an order of child support issued  
2 by a court or agency shall be based on the

3 (1) percentages of physical custody exercised by the child's parents; a  
4 minor parent's custody of the child shall be imputed to the parents of the minor parent,  
5 regardless of where the minor parent lives, except that

6 (A) if the minor parent and child live with a parent of the  
7 noncustodial minor parent, the minor parent's custody of the child shall be  
8 imputed to the parent of the noncustodial minor parent; and

9 (B) a minor parent's custody of a child may not be imputed to  
10 the parents of the minor parent if the minor parent and child do not live with  
11 a parent of the minor parent because

12 (i) neither parent will allow the minor and child to live  
13 in the residence of the minor's parent; or

14 (ii) the physical or emotional health or safety of the  
15 minor parent or the minor's child would be jeopardized if the minor and  
16 the minor's child lived in the same residence with the minor's parent;

17 and

18 (2) incomes of the child's grandparents and parents.

19 (f) To the extent that (e) of this section applies,

20 (1) the child's grandparents are considered to have a duty to support the  
21 child and are subject to laws, regulations, and court rules relating to support of the  
22 child; and

23 (2) a grandparent who is determined under applicable agency  
24 regulations and court rules to be the obligor for purposes of paying child support on  
25 behalf of a grandchild is subject to all laws, regulations, and court rules applicable to  
26 child support obligors.

27 (g) An order of support against a child's grandparent under (e) of this section  
28 and a grandparent's duty to support a child under (f) of this section is terminated,  
29 without the need for obtaining a modification of a child support order, when one of  
30 the child's parents reaches the age of majority or has the disabilities of minority  
31 removed under AS 09.55.590, whichever occurs earlier. However, to the extent that

1 a grandparent may have accrued arrearages, the grandparent remains an obligor subject  
2 to this chapter.

3 \* **Sec. 2.** AS 25.27 is amended by adding new sections to read:

4 Sec. 25.27.244. ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST DELINQUENT OBLIGOR'S  
5 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE. (a) The agency shall compile and maintain a list of  
6 obligors who are not in substantial compliance with a support order or payment  
7 schedule negotiated under (g)(1) of this section. The list must include the names,  
8 social security numbers, dates of birth, and last known addresses of the obligors. The  
9 list shall be updated by the agency on a monthly basis.

10 (b) The agency shall, on a monthly basis, provide a copy of the list to each  
11 licensing entity through a computer-readable magnetic medium. A licensing entity  
12 subject to this section shall implement procedures to accept and process the list.  
13 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a licensing entity may not issue or  
14 renew a license for a person on the list except as provided in this section.

15 (c) Promptly after receiving an application from an applicant and before  
16 issuing or renewing a license, a licensing entity shall determine whether the applicant  
17 is on the most recent list provided by the agency. If the applicant is on the list, the  
18 licensing entity shall immediately serve notice under (e) of this section of the licensing  
19 entity's intent to withhold issuance or renewal of the license. The notice shall be  
20 considered given when delivered personally to the obligor or deposited in the U.S. mail  
21 addressed to the applicant's last known mailing address on file with the licensing  
22 entity.

23 (d) A licensing entity shall issue a temporary license valid for a period of 150  
24 days to an applicant whose name is on the list if the applicant is otherwise eligible for  
25 a license. The temporary license may not be extended. Only one temporary license  
26 may be issued during a regular license term and its validity shall coincide with the first  
27 150 days of that license term. A license for the full or remainder of the license term  
28 may be issued or renewed only upon compliance with this section. If a license or  
29 application is denied under this section, funds paid by the applicant or licensee shall  
30 be refunded by the licensing entity after retention of the temporary license fee, if any.

31 (e) Notices for use under (c) of this section shall be developed by each

1 licensing entity under guidelines provided by the agency and are subject to approval  
2 by the agency. The notice must include the address and telephone number of the  
3 agency and shall emphasize the necessity of obtaining a release from the agency as a  
4 condition for the issuance or renewal of a license. The notice must inform an  
5 applicant whose license is governed by (d) of this section that the licensing entity shall  
6 issue a temporary license for 150 calendar days under (d) of this section if the  
7 applicant is otherwise eligible and that, upon expiration of that time period, the license  
8 will be denied unless the licensing entity has received a release from the agency. The  
9 agency shall also develop a form that the applicant may use to request a review by the  
10 agency. A copy of this form shall be included with each notice sent under (c) of this  
11 section.

12 (f) The agency shall establish review procedures consistent with this section  
13 to allow an applicant to have the underlying arrearage and relevant defenses  
14 investigated, to provide an applicant information on the process of obtaining a  
15 modification of a support order, or to provide an applicant assistance in the  
16 establishment of a payment schedule on arrearages if the circumstances warrant.

17 (g) If the applicant wishes to challenge being included on the list, the applicant  
18 shall submit to the agency a written request for review within 30 days after receiving  
19 the notice under (c) of this section by using the form developed under (e) of this  
20 section. Within 30 days after receiving a written request for review, the agency shall  
21 inform the applicant in writing of the agency's findings. The agency shall immediately  
22 send a release to the appropriate licensing entity and the applicant if any of the  
23 following conditions is met:

24 (1) the applicant is found to be in substantial compliance with each  
25 support order applicable to the applicant or has negotiated an agreement with the  
26 agency for a payment schedule on arrearages and is in substantial compliance with the  
27 negotiated agreement; if the applicant fails to be in substantial compliance with an  
28 agreement negotiated under this paragraph, the agency shall send to the appropriate  
29 licensing entity a revocation of any release previously sent to the entity for that  
30 applicant;

31 (2) the applicant has submitted a timely request for review to the

1 agency, but the agency will be unable to complete the review and send notice of  
2 findings to the applicant in sufficient time for the applicant to file a timely request for  
3 judicial relief within the 150-day period during which the applicant's temporary license  
4 is valid under (d) of this section; this paragraph applies only if the delay in completing  
5 the review process is not the result of the applicant's failure to act in a reasonable,  
6 timely, and diligent manner upon receiving notice from the licensing entity that the  
7 applicant's name is on the list;

8 (3) the applicant has, within 30 days after receiving the agency's  
9 findings following a request for review under (2) of this subsection, filed and served  
10 a request for judicial relief under this section, but a resolution of that relief will not  
11 be made within the 150-day period of the temporary license under (d) of this section;  
12 this paragraph applies only if the delay in completing the judicial relief process is not  
13 the result of the applicant's failure to act in a reasonable, timely, and diligent manner  
14 upon receiving the agency's notice of findings; or

15 (4) the applicant has obtained a judicial finding of substantial  
16 compliance.

17 (h) An applicant is required to act with diligence in responding to notices from  
18 the licensing entity and the agency with the recognition that the temporary license  
19 granted under (d) of this section will lapse after 150 days and that the agency and,  
20 where appropriate, the court must have time to act within that 150-day period. An  
21 applicant's delay in acting, without good cause, that directly results in the inability of  
22 the agency to complete a review of the applicant's request or the court to hear the  
23 request for judicial relief within the required period does not constitute the diligence  
24 required under this section that would justify the issuance of a release.

25 (i) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the agency may not issue a  
26 release if the applicant is not in substantial compliance with the order for support or  
27 is not in substantial compliance with an agreement negotiated under (g)(1) of this  
28 section. The agency shall notify the applicant in writing that the applicant may request  
29 any or all of the following: (1) judicial relief from the agency's decision not to issue  
30 a release or the agency's decision to revoke a release under (g)(1) of this section; (2)  
31 a judicial determination of substantial compliance; (3) a modification of the support

1 order. The notice must also contain the name and address of the court in which the  
2 applicant may file the request for relief and inform the applicant that the applicant's  
3 name shall remain on the list if the applicant does not request judicial relief within 30  
4 days after receiving the notice. The applicant shall comply with all statutes and rules  
5 of court implementing this section. This section does not limit an applicant's authority  
6 under other law to request an order to show cause or notice of motion to modify a  
7 support order or to fix a payment schedule on arrearages accruing under a support  
8 order or to obtain a court finding of substantial compliance with a support order.

9 (j) A request for judicial relief from the agency's decision must state the  
10 grounds on which relief is requested and the judicial action shall be limited to those  
11 stated grounds. Judicial relief under this subsection is not an appeal, and shall be  
12 governed by court rules adopted to implement this section. Unless otherwise provided  
13 by court rule, the court shall hold an evidentiary hearing within 20 calendar days of  
14 the filing of service on the opposing party. The court's decision shall be limited to a  
15 determination of each of the following issues:

16 (1) whether there is a support order or a payment schedule on  
17 arrearages;

18 (2) whether the petitioner is the obligor covered by the support order;  
19 and

20 (3) whether the obligor is in substantial compliance with the support  
21 order or payment schedule.

22 (k) If the court finds that the obligor is in substantial compliance with the  
23 support order or payment schedule, the agency shall immediately send a release under  
24 (g) of this section to the appropriate licensing entity and the applicant.

25 (l) When the obligor is in substantial compliance with a support order or  
26 payment schedule, the agency shall mail to the applicant and the appropriate licensing  
27 entity a release stating that the applicant is in substantial compliance. The receipt of  
28 a release shall serve to notify the applicant and the licensing entity that, for the  
29 purposes of this section, the applicant is in substantial compliance with the support  
30 order or payment schedule unless the agency, under (a) of this section, certifies  
31 subsequent to the issuance of a release that the applicant is once again not in

1 substantial compliance with a support order or payment schedule.

2 (m) The agency may enter into interagency agreements with the state agencies  
3 that have responsibility for the administration of licensing entities as necessary to  
4 implement this section to the extent that it is cost effective to implement the  
5 interagency agreements. The agreements shall provide for the receipt by the other  
6 state agencies and licensing entities of federal funds to cover that portion of costs  
7 allowable in federal law and regulation and incurred by the state agencies and licensing  
8 entities in implementing this section.

9 (n) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the licensing entities subject  
10 to this section shall assess a fee for issuance of a temporary license under this section.  
11 The licensing entity shall set the amount of the fee so that the fees collected under this  
12 section cover the costs of implementing and administering this section.

13 (o) The process described in (g) of this section is the sole administrative  
14 remedy for contesting the issuance to the applicant of a temporary license or the denial  
15 of a license under this section. The procedures specified in AS 44.62.330 - 44.62.630  
16 (Administrative Procedure Act) do not apply to the denial or failure to issue or renew  
17 a license under this section.

18 (p) The agency and licensing entities, as appropriate, shall adopt regulations  
19 necessary to implement this section.

20 (q) In this section,

21 (1) "applicant" means a person applying for issuance or renewal of a  
22 license;

23 (2) "license"

24 (A) means, except as provided in (B) of this paragraph, a  
25 license, certificate, permit, registration, or other authorization that, at the time  
26 of issuance, will be valid for more than 150 days that may be acquired from  
27 a state agency to perform an occupation, including the following:

28 (i) license relating to boxing or wrestling under  
29 AS 05.10;

30 (ii) authorization to perform an occupation regulated  
31 under AS 08;

- 1 (iii) teacher certificate under AS 14.20;
- 2 (iv) authorization under AS 18.08 to perform emergency  
3 medical services;
- 4 (v) asbestos worker certification under AS 18.31;
- 5 (vi) boiler operator's license under AS 18.60.395;
- 6 (vii) certificate of fitness under AS 18.62;
- 7 (viii) hazardous painting certification under AS 18.63;
- 8 (ix) security guard license under AS 18.65.400 -  
9 18.65.490;
- 10 (x) license relating to insurance under AS 21.27;
- 11 (xi) employment agency permit under AS 23.15.330 -  
12 23.15.520;
- 13 (xii) registration as a broker-dealer, agent, or investment  
14 adviser under AS 45.55.030;
- 15 (xiii) certification as a pesticide applicator under  
16 AS 46.03.320;
- 17 (xiv) certification as a storage tank worker or contractor  
18 under AS 46.03.375; and
- 19 (xv) certification as a water and wastewater works  
20 operator under AS 46.30;
- 21 (xvi) a vessel license issued under AS 16.05.490 or

8 (6) "substantial compliance with a support order or payment schedule"

10 of this section, whichever is applicable, the obligor has no more than \$2,500 past due  
11 and has cumulatively paid an amount equal to or greater than the amount due for eight  
12 months during the past 12 months; with respect to a support order or payment schedule  
13 that has been in effect for less than one year, "substantial compliance" means that the  
14 obligor has no more than \$2,500 past due and has cumulatively paid an amount equal  
15 to or greater than 67 percent of the amount due during the period the support order or  
16 payment schedule has been in effect.

17 Sec. 25.27.246. ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST DELINQUENT OBLIGOR'S  
18 DRIVER'S LICENSE. (a) The agency shall compile and maintain a list of obligors  
19 who have a driver's license and are not in substantial compliance with a support order  
20 or payment schedule negotiated under (f)(1) of this section. The list must include the  
21 names, social security numbers, dates of birth, and last known addresses of the  
22 obligors. The list shall be updated by the agency on a monthly basis.

23 (b) The agency shall serve notice under (d) of this section to each person on  
24 the list that the person's driver's license will be suspended in 150 days, and will not  
25 be reissued or renewed the next time it is applied for if the person's name is on the list  
26 at the time of the subsequent application, unless the licensee receives a release from  
27 the agency. The notice shall be considered given when delivered personally to the  
28 obligor or deposited in the U.S. mail addressed to the obligor's last known mailing  
29 address on file with the agency.

30 (c) If the licensee fails to obtain a release during the 150-day period following  
31 notice under (b) and (d) of this section, the agency shall notify the department that the

1 licensee's driver's license should be suspended and further renewals or applications  
2 should be denied until the agency sends the department a release for the licensee.  
3 Upon receiving the agency's notice under this subsection, the department shall suspend  
4 the licensee's driver's license and may not issue or renew a driver's license for the  
5 licensee until the department receives a release to do so from the agency. If a license  
6 or application is suspended or denied under this section, funds paid by the applicant  
7 or licensee may not be refunded by the department.

8 (d) The notice under (b) of this section must include the address and telephone  
9 number of the agency and shall emphasize the necessity of obtaining a release from  
10 the agency as a condition for avoiding suspension or denial of the person's driver's  
11 license. The notice must also inform the licensee that, if a license or application is  
12 suspended or denied under this section, funds paid by the licensee will not be refunded  
13 by the department. The agency shall also develop a form that the licensee may use  
14 to request a review by the agency. A copy of this form shall be included with each  
15 notice sent under (b) of this section.

16 (e) The agency shall establish review procedures consistent with this section  
17 to allow a licensee to have the underlying arrearage and relevant defenses investigated,  
18 to provide a licensee with information on the process of obtaining a modification of  
19 a support order, or to provide a licensee with assistance in the establishment of a  
20 payment schedule on arrearages if the circumstances warrant.

21 (f) If a licensee wishes to challenge being included on the list, the licensee  
22 shall submit to the agency a written request for review within 30 days after the notice  
23 under (b) of this section was personally delivered or postmarked by using the form  
24 developed under (d) of this section. Within 30 days after receiving a written request  
25 for review, the agency shall inform the licensee in writing of the agency's findings.  
26 The agency shall immediately send a release to the department and the licensee if any  
27 of the following conditions is met:

28 (1) the licensee is found to be in substantial compliance with each  
29 support order applicable to the licensee or has negotiated an agreement with the agency  
30 for a payment schedule on arrearages and is in substantial compliance with the  
31 negotiated agreement; if the licensee fails to be in substantial compliance with an

1 agreement negotiated under this paragraph, the agency shall send to the department a  
2 revocation of any release previously sent to the entity for that licensee;

3 (2) the licensee has submitted a timely request for review to the  
4 agency, but the agency will be unable to complete the review and send notice of  
5 findings to the licensee in sufficient time for the licensee to file a timely request for  
6 judicial relief within the 150-day period before the licensee's license will be suspended  
7 under (c) of this section; this paragraph applies only if the delay in completing the  
8 review process is not the result of the licensee's failure to act in a reasonable, timely,  
9 and diligent manner upon receiving notice from the agency that the licensee's driver's  
10 license will be suspended in 150 days;

11 (3) the licensee has, within 30 days after receiving the agency's findings  
12 following a request for review under (2) of this subsection, filed and served a request  
13 for judicial relief under this section, but a resolution of that relief will not be made  
14 within the 150-day period before license suspension under (c) of this section; this  
15 paragraph applies only if the delay in completing the judicial relief process is not the  
16 result of the licensee's failure to act in a reasonable, timely, and diligent manner upon  
17 receiving the agency's notice of findings; or

18 (4) the licensee has obtained a judicial finding of substantial  
19 compliance.

20 (g) A licensee is required to act with diligence in responding to notices from  
21 the agency with the recognition that the person's driver's license will be suspended  
22 after 150 days or that a subsequent license will not be issued and that the agency and,  
23 where appropriate, the court must have time to act within that 150-day period or before  
24 the subsequent license is needed, as applicable. A licensee's delay in acting, without  
25 good cause, that directly results in the inability of the agency to complete a review of  
26 the licensee's request or the court to hear the request for judicial relief within the  
27 required period does not constitute the diligence required under this section that would  
28 justify the issuance of a release.

29 (h) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the agency may not issue a  
30 release if the applicant is not in substantial compliance with the order for support or  
31 is not in substantial compliance with an agreement negotiated under (f)(1) of this

1 section. The agency shall notify the licensee in writing that the licensee may request  
2 any or all of the following: (1) judicial relief from the agency's decision not to issue  
3 a release or the agency's decision to revoke a release under (f)(1) of this section; (2)  
4 a judicial determination of substantial compliance; (3) a modification of the support  
5 order. The notice must also contain the name and address of the court in which the  
6 licensee may file the request for relief and inform the licensee that the licensee's name  
7 shall remain on the list if the licensee does not request judicial relief within 30 days  
8 after receiving the notice. The licensee shall comply with all statutes and rules of

6 (l) The process described in (f) of this section is the sole administrative  
7 remedy for contesting the suspension or the denial of a driver's license under this  
8 section. The procedures specified in AS 28 or AS 44.62.330 - 44.62.630  
9 (Administrative Procedure Act) do not apply to the suspension or failure to issue or  
10 renew a license under this section.

11 (m) The agency and department, as appropriate, shall adopt regulations  
12 necessary to implement this section.

13 (n) In this section,

14 (1) "department" means the Department of Public Safety;

15 (2) "driver's license" or "license" means a driver's license, as defined  
16 in AS 28.40.100;

17 (3) "licensee" means a person holding or requesting a driver's license;

18 (4) "list" means the list of obligors compiled and maintained under (a)  
19 of this section;

20 (5) "substantial compliance with a support order or payment schedule"  
21 means that, with respect to a support order or a negotiated payment schedule under (f)  
22 of this section, whichever is applicable, the obligor has no more than \$2,500 past due  
23 and has cumulatively paid an amount equal to or greater than the amount due for eight  
24 months during the past 12 months; with respect to a support order or payment schedule  
25 that has been in effect for less than one year, "substantial compliance" means that the  
26 obligor has no more than \$2,500 past due and has cumulatively paid an amount equal  
27 to or greater than 67 percent of the amount due during the period the support order or

30 Sec. 47.25.311. **INELIGIBILITY FOR ASSISTANCE.** (a) A person is  
31 permanently ineligible for assistance under AS 47.25.310 - 47.25.420 upon conviction

1 of violating AS 11.56.210 or a law in another jurisdiction with elements substantially  
2 similar to AS 11.56.210 if the conviction arose out of a written or recorded statement  
3 submitted in order to apply for or continue receiving assistance under AS 47.07, this  
4 chapter, or similar laws in another jurisdiction.

5 (c) A person is not eligible to receive benefits under AS 47.25.310 - 47.25.420  
6 for more than a total of 60 months as the caretaker of a dependent child or as a  
7 pregnant woman unless the person is

8 (1) determined, under regulations of the department, to be physically  
9 or mentally unable to perform any gainful activity; or

10 (2) a parent who is providing care for a child with a developmental  
11 disability, as defined in AS 47.80.900.

19 47.25.420 is less than the federal money available during the previous federal fiscal  
20 year, the department shall adjust the monetary maximums and payment amounts  
21 authorized under this section so that the general fund money from nonfederal sources  
22 does not replace the federal money reduction.

4 (b) The Department of Revenue, child support enforcement agency, may adopt  
5 regulations necessary to implement sec. 16 of this Act.

7 Department of Revenue, child support enforcement agency, may proceed to adopt regulations
