**A BILL**

**FOR AN ACT ENTITLED**

1 "An Act making and amending appropriations and reappropriations; making and  
2 amending appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of  
3 Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund; and providing for an  
4 effective date."

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

6 \* **Section 1.** ALASKA CLEAN WATER FUND. The sum of \$9,649,500 is appropriated  
7 to the Alaska clean water fund (AS 46.03.032) for the Alaska clean water loan program from  
8 the following sources:

11 \* **Sec. 2.** ALASKA DRINKING WATER FUND. The sum of \$8,956,600 is appropriated  
12 to the Alaska drinking water fund (AS 46.03.036) for the Alaska drinking water loan program  
13 from the following sources:

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1 Federal receipts 7,463,800

2 \* **Sec. 3.** ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY. The  
3 sum of \$18,000,000 that was declared available, for appropriation by the board of directors  
4 of the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority, as the fiscal year 2000 dividend  
5 from the unrestricted balance in the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority  
6 revolving fund (AS 44.88.060) is appropriated in secs. 4 and 98 of this Act.

7 \* **Sec. 4.** CAPITAL PROJECT MATCHING GRANT PROGRAMS. (a) The sum of  
8 \$13,150,000 is appropriated from the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority  
9 revolving fund (AS 44.88.060) to the municipal capital project matching grant fund  
10 (AS 37.06.010(b)) in the Department of Administration to provide grants to municipalities  
11 under the municipal capital project matching grant program.

12 (b) The sum of \$1,850,000 is appropriated from the Alaska Industrial Development  
13 and Export Authority revolving fund (AS 44.88.060) to the unincorporated community capital  
14 project matching grant fund (AS 37.06.020(b)) in the Department of Community and Regional  
15 Affairs to provide grants to unincorporated communities under the unincorporated community  
16 capital project matching grant program.

17 (c) An amount equal to the interest earned on money in the individual grant accounts  
18 in the municipal capital project matching grant fund (AS 37.06.010(b)) and the unincorporated  
19 community capital project matching grant fund (AS 37.06.020(b)) is appropriated from the  
20 general fund to the respective funds. The interest is calculated using the average percentage  
21 interest rate received by other accounts in the state's general investment fund that received  
22 interest during fiscal year 1999. The appropriations made by this subsection are allocated pro  
23 rata to each individual grant account based on the balance of the account on the close of  
24 business on June 30, 1999.
