\*Sec\_\_\_. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES. Contingent upon passage by the First Regular Session of the Twenty-Second Alaska State Legislature and the enactment into law of an increase in the receipts collected under AS 43.60.010, the following amount is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Health and Social Services for the fiscal year ending in June 30, 2002 for the purposes described:

PURPOSE	AMOUNT
Alcohol and Drug Abuse Grants	\$700.00
<i>Restores a reduction from the base funding now available for grants. The loss of these funds would result in a 4% reduction of grant funds across all ADA grants to service providers.</i>	
Juvenile Justice-Probation Services	\$564.5
<i>These funds provide for the first year of a three year initiative to intervene earlier and more effectively with juveniles. The division would locate nine additional juvenile probation officers in those areas with the highest caseload and programmatic needs.</i>	
Subsidized Adoption & Guardianship	\$1,828.1
<i>This restores general funds of \$1,069.0 from the FY2002 caseload growth increment and approves the transfer of \$758.2 from Foster Care Base Rate to Subsidized Adoption and Guardianship. This will fund approximately 235 children.</i>	
Services to Chronically Mentally Ill	\$394.5GF/MH
<i>This fund source switch request replaces with GF/MH the federal funding for deinstitutionalizing six long-term residents of API and reducing the size of the Katmai unit from 25 to 20 beds.</i>

*This restores the 67% reduction in the increment requested for the Back to Basics Initiative which significantly reduces the necessary improvements in Alaska's disease control efforts, such as TB, HIV, Hepatitis, and sexually transmitted diseases.*

*This would provide funding for community-based grants in three specific areas: community-based programming, school-based youth programs and cessation services.*
