# **Twenty-second Day**

Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Porter at 11:02 a m.

Roll call showed 35 members present. Representatives Cissna, Kohring, Moses, and Williams had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representative Ogan was absent and his presence was noted later.
