ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary)

Article 7A of this bill requires the department to develop a standards-based Alaska History curriculum, within grades 9-12. This secondary-based, Alaska standards-based curriculum is already being developed by the Alaska Humanities Forum. The Forum received \$400,000 of federal funding in 2003 to create this curriculum and additional federal funding in 2004. Representatives from the Forum presented information about the curriculum development to the State Board of Education at its March 2004 meeting. The curriculum is of extremely high quality, has been developed by experts in the field of Alaska history, and is on-line and interactive. The department believes that use of this curriculum is in order, rather than having the department create a separate Alaska History curriculum at additional cost to the state.
