**ANALYSIS:** (Attach a separate page if necessary)

This bill has three distinct aspects. First, it allows a borough that enters into an agreement with a city in that borough to cooperatively or jointly provide for economic development to use areawide or nonareawide borough tax revenues for that purpose. Secondly, it addresses the assessment, levy, and collection of property taxes following municipal annexation and detachment. Thirdly, the bill modifies existing laws relating to merger and consolidation of municipal governments. With regard to mergers and consolidations, the bill requires signatures on a local option municipal merger or consolidation petition to be gathered within 365 days. It also would rescind the current areawide majority vote to determine the outcome of a local option city/borough merger or consolidation. Instead, voter approval would be required in various classes of voters created under the bill. This legislation would have no fiscal effect on the department.
