ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary)

This bill will allow municipalities, by ordinance, to elect to provide an emergency services dispatch system. It also addresses methods to be used by municipalities to collect a 911 surcharge which will be limited in use to the 911 system plus the actual labor and equipment used to provide emergency services dispatch, but not for costs of providing the medical, police, fire, rescue, or other emergency services, or for any other purpose.

This legislation amends current statute to improve immunity for municipalities for the operation of emergency services dispatch systems. It will also provide immunity from actionable claims against the state if the action is based on the exercise or performance in connection with an emergency services dispatch system under specified circumstances.

There is no fiscal impact anticipated to the Department of Public Safety.
