## **Eighty-fifth Day**

Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Kott at 10:44 a.m.

Roll call showed 35 members present. Representatives Kohring, Kookesh, and Wolf had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Harris and Williams were absent and their presence was noted later.

Representative Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent that Representative Kerttula be excused from a call of the House from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. today. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Sam Dalin of River of Glory Church. Representative McGuire moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
