Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Kott at 10:47 a.m.

Roll call showed 36 members present. Representative Joule had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Heinze, Kapsner, and Masek were absent and their presence was noted later.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Greg Lindsay of Northern Light United Church. Representative Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

President Therriault appointed Representative Dahlstrom and Senator Dyson to escort the Senator to the joint session.

The Senate Sergeant-at-Arms announced the Senator's entrance into the House Chamber.

Senator Murkowski was escorted to the rostrum and welcomed by President Therriault.

Senator Murkowski received a standing ovation and was escorted from the Chamber by Representative Dahlstrom and Senator Dyson.
