Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 10:13 a.m.

The roll showed eleven members present. Senators Cowdery, Ellis, Elton, Ogan, Taylor, Wilken were excused from a call of the Senate. Senators Hoffman, Wagoner were absent. The seat from District R was vacant.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Robert Sherwood of the Church of the Nazarene. Senator Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
