Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 10:30 a.m.

Mr. President, Honorable Senators, members of the staff, distinguished guests and visitors, with deepest respect for the religious beliefs of all Alaskans, we offer this prayer:

Lord, we recognize that today is Ash Wednesday. Millions of people mark this as the beginning of a time of self-denial, of self-examination, of soulsearching. It is a time to seek discernment and wisdom.

In the hours and sessions ahead, these men and women will be doing a lot of soul-searching, a lot of questioning, as they seek for solutions to many difficult problems.
