Forty-fifth Day

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 10:55 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. Senator Davis was excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Dan Doran of Faith Lutheran Church. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

The advancement of SENATE BILL NO. 264 (Repeal Pipeline Preapplication Deadline) to third reading on February 23 (page 2266) was invalid. Article 2, Section 14 of the Alaska Constitution requires a vote of three-fourths of the body, which is 15 members. Since the motion did not receive the necessary votes, the bill has been placed back on today's calendar under Third Reading of Senate Bills.

President Therriault appointed Representatives Berkowitz and Kerttula to escort Chief Justice Bryner to the Joint Session.

The Senate Sergeant at Arms, Jamiann Stevens, announced Chief Justice Bryner's entrance to the House Chamber.

The Honorable Chief Justice Alexander O. Bryner was escorted to the rostrum and introduced by President Therriault.

Chief Justice Bryner delivered his address. This address appears in House and Senate Joint Journal Supplement No. 15.

The Chief Justice received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Representatives Kerttula and Berkowitz.

Senator Ben Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the Joint Session stand in adjournment. Without objection, President Therriault adjourned the Joint Session at 11:44 a.m.
