CHAIR HEINZE announced that the committee would reconsider HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 28, Relating to the socioeconomic impacts of salmon harvesting cooperatives.

CHAIR HEINZE explained that two fiscal notes had been received since the last hearing: a zero fiscal note from the Legislative Affairs Agency reflecting the cost of distributing the resolution, and a fiscal note [for \$100,000] from the University of Alaska for the cost of the study.
