ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary)

This bill divides the crime of unsworn falsification into first and second degree violations and establishes that, as it relates to an application for a permanent fund dividend, the crime of unsworn falsification is a first degree offense and a class C felony, while the crime of unsworn falsification is otherwise a second degree offense and a class A misdemeanor. The bill conforms existing statutory language regarding unsworn falsification to reflect this delineation. The bill adds a couple of new authorized absences under eligibility for a permanent fund dividend. The bill establishes the existing fraud investigation unit in statute in order to facilitate access to information held by other law enforcement agencies. Passage of this legislation will not have a foreseeable fiscal impact on the Department of Law.
