Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Harris at 11:18 a.m.

Roll call showed 35 members present. Representative Kott had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Anderson, Kerttula, and McGuire were absent and their presence was noted later.

Representative Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent that Representative Kapsner be excused from a call of the House today to 3:00 p.m. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
