Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Harris at 10:58 p.m.

Roll call showed 35 members present. Representatives Foster and Weyhrauch had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Kott, McGuire, and Rokeberg were absent and their presence was noted later.

The invocation was offered by Anna Sutton, House Page, who performed a violin solo of *America the Beautiful*.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Representative Gatto.
