ANALYSIS: *(Attach a separate page if necessary)*

This bill increases the severity of subsequent Assault IV convictions, adds a new element to the crime of Resisting or Interfering with Arrest, adds two new substances to the schedule IVA list of prohibited substances and clarifies in statute that a third conviction for theft within five years increases the severity of the crime one level. This bill also addresses problems concerning the release of persons found to be incompetent to stand trial and repeals statutes to allow for the state to prosecute for an act that another jurisdiction has already prosecuted. Finally, this bills allows the court to issue search warrants telephonically and provides for a later return of search warrant inventory.

Passage of this legislation would cause a slight increase in the number of arrests made and cases referred for prosecution. This increase can be assumed by the DPS and will have no fiscal impact on the department.
