ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary)

This bill elevates certain convictions for importing alcohol from a misdemeanor to a felony if a person has two or more prior convictions within 10 years of the present offense. The bill provides for certain minimum penalties for misdemeanor and felony convictions. The bill also provides for a manslaughter conviction if a person dies from ingesting alcohol that was imported in violation of local option laws.

This bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact due to the limited number of cases currently charged as misdemeanor. It is, however, impossible to predict the fiscal impact with certainty due to the new manslaughter crime and the cost pressure that will result from increased penalties. But if caseload trends remain the same it is expected that this bill will not have a fiscal impact.
