The Honorable Sarah Palin was escorted to the rostrum and welcomed by President Green.

Governor Palin delivered her address. This address appears in House and Senate Joint Journal Supplement No. 1.

Governor Sarah Palin received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Representative Stoltze and Senator Therriault.

Senator Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the Joint Session stand in adjournment. Without objection, President Green adjourned the Joint Session at 7:38 p.m.
