Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Green at 11:02 a.m.

The roll showed seventeen members present. Senators Bunde, Dyson, McGuire were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, the Reverend Bob Stevens of St. Brendan's Episcopal Church. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
