Forty-fourth Day

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Green at 10:45 a.m.

The roll showed sixteen members present. Senator Kookesh was excused from a call of the Senate. Senators Davis, Hoffman, McGuire were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Tom Matthews of the Douglas Island Bible Church. Senator Olson moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Recognizing there is a great variety of religious diversity in our midst here, I would ask you to join me in a time of prayer, as we ask the Lord to bless another day of your deliberations.

The Chief Justice received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Senator Thomas and Representative LeDoux.

Senator Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the Joint Session stand in adjournment. Without objection, President Green adjourned the Joint Session at 11:38 a.m.
