SB 61

Renumber the following bill sections accordingly.

Senator Hoffman moved for the adoption of Amendment No. 1. Without objection, Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

Senator Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the bill be considered engrossed, advanced to third reading and placed on final passage. Without objection, it was so ordered.

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 61(FIN) am was read the third time.
