# **One Hundred Second Day**

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Green at 11:05 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. Senator Bunde was excused from a call of the Senate.

Notwithstanding that part of AS 24.05.090, amended in sec. 3 of this Act, relating to the location for convening regular sessions, the legislature shall convene the Second Regular Session of the Twenty-Fifth Alaska State Legislature in the capital. By March 1, 2008, the legislative council shall introduce a bill through the rules committee of each house that conforms other statutes to the change in the location for convening regular sessions made in AS 24.05.090."
