ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary)

This bill imposes new limits on the possession, importation, shipping, or transporting of alcoholic beverages into a local option area. The bill also reduces the amount of alcohol a package store may send to a person living in a local option area each month, and would make a similar change in the threshold amount of alcohol necessary to incur penalties for bootlegging alcohol. Finally, the bill imposes new sanctions for liquor licensees whose agents or employees furnish alcoholic beverages to a person under age 21. It is difficult to predict with any certainty what additional criminal prosecutions will result with passage of the bill; however, when considered in combination with the potential reduction in alcohol related crime such as assault, domestic violence, etc. the fiscal impact can only be described as indeterminate at best.

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
