This bill provides that a person who is restricted from purchasing alcohol may not solicit another to purchase alcoholic beverages or misrepresent the restriction to a licensee. This bill provides provisions that the court in imposing sentence on a defendant convicted of an offense may order the defendant to refrain from consuming alcoholic beverages for a period up to the lifetime of the defendant. Enactment of the bill is not anticipated to fiscally impact the Department of Law.
