SB 202 would adopt a new crime – motivation by prejudice, bias, or hatred. A person commits the crime if the person commits a crime prohibited in Title 11, and knowingly directed the conduct to a victim because of the victim's race, sex, color, creed, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, ancestry, or national origin. The penalty for the new crime would increase the penalty for the underlying crime one level, so that a class A misdemeanor that is motivated by prejudice, bias, or hatred, would then be a class C felony.

Passage of this legislation would have no foreseeable fiscal impact on the Department of Law.
