ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary)

CSSCR16(L&C) creates an eleven member Economic Development Planning Commission to develop and recommend to the Governor and to the Legislature visions and strategies that will encourage economic development in the State. The Commission is composed of two Legislators, seven public members, and the Commissioners of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development and Labor and Workforce Development or their designees. It is anticipated the Commission will meet by teleconference and will also hold 3 meetings per year which require travel. The Commission will review recommendations of various economic development planning processes, consider and make recommendations regarding ways to foster economic development, prepare legislation based on the recommendations of the Commission, and present the recommendations and proposed legislation to the Legislative Council, Budget and Audit Committee, and the House and Senate Labor and Commerce Committees by January 30, 2011, and may present a supplemental report by December 15, 2011. The Commission is authorized to begin work immediately on the appointment of members or April 30, 2010, whichever is earlier and will terminate June 30, 2012. Costs to print the Commission report and to teleconference meetings will be absorbed within existing budgets. Any FY10 Legislative costs for the Commission will be absorbed in the Legislative Council Budget.
