**Analysis**

CSHB 28 allows a military spouse to obtain a temporary license in their field of practice as long as they meet the professional standards which are already required by law or regulation. The temporary license will be valid for six months at which time the military spouse has the option of obtaining an Alaska license or asking for a renewal of the temporary license. The legislation would require the Department to implement regulations to establish criteria for issuing a temporary courtesy license to a nonresident so they may lawfully practice their occupation.

Last year's passage of SB 292 – relating to the registration and operation of pawnbrokers, allowed no window of time between the effective date of pawnbroker regulations and the effective licensing date of affected parties. CSHB 28 would give current non-municipal pawnbrokers the option of applying for a temporary license before Sept. 1, 2011 so they may continue to engage in business. Between September 1, 2011 and December 31, 2011 they would then need to obtain a permanent pawnbroker license through the Department. This provision would only apply to persons currently engaged in business as a pawnbroker as of June 31, 2011. Any new pawnbroker would need to apply for a permanent license through the Department.

The agency does not predict a significant fiscal impact as a result of the proposed statute. Accordingly, the agency submits a zero fiscal note.
