Analysis

This bill amends the crime of cruelty to animals to include failing to care for five or more animals and causing death, severe physical pain, or prolonged suffering to the animals. The Office of Public Advocacy cannot reliably predict how many new cases will be charged under this expanded definition ,and therefore, the agency has submitted an indeterminate fiscal note.
