Analysis

This bill establishes procedures relating to the issuance, suspension, and revocation of certification of police officers by the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC); makes confidential certain information that personally identifies a police officer; and prohibits public employers of police officers from requiring police officer employees to submit to a lie detector test.

This bill as currently proposed would have no fiscal impact to the Alaska Police Standards Council.
