Analysis

This bill amends AS 12.50 by adding a new sections dealing with identification of persons by eyewitnesses.

The bill requires law enforcement agencies to adopt specific procedures for conducting photo and live lineups that meet several minimum requirements. Those requirements include the recording of specific information from the witness and assignment of an independent administrator to conduct the lineup, if possible, or a procedure that achieves neutral administration of the action.

The bill also requires the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to create, administer, and conduct a training program for law enforcement officers and recruits in the methods, technical aspects, and scientific findings related to eyewitness proceedings.

It is anticipated that the DPS Public Safety Training Academy will be able to create, administer, and conduct the training required under this bill using existing resources to incorporate it into the training curriculum for new recruits and existing law enforcement officers. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
