Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Chenault at 11:05 a.m.

Roll call showed 34 members present. Representative Thompson had been excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Guttenberg, Hawker and Tuck were absent and their presence was noted later. Representatives Holmes and Neuman were absent.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative Dick. Representative P. Wilson moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
