Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Stevens at 10:45 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senators Hoffman, Wagoner were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Dr. Paul Beran, Pastor Emeritus of Resurrection Lutheran Church. Senator Olson moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

The Chief Justice received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Senator French and Representative Gruenberg.

Senator Meyer moved and asked unanimous consent that the Joint Session stand in adjournment. Without objection, President Stevens adjourned the Joint Session at 11:49 a.m.
