Analysis

This bill allows DMV to issue a driver's license for a duration of less than five years if the person is authorized to stay in the United States for less than five years, or the period of authorized stay is indefinite.

The impact of this bill on DMV will be minimal. Additional training will be provided to staff to ensure issued licenses expire with the applicant's legal stay.

This bill has no fiscal impact on DMV.
