BILL NO. CSHB 21(FIN)

Analysis

There is no fiscal impact to the department. The current language provides a method for school districts to pursue an alternate school calendar without reducing the educational opportunities for students. This CS provides clarity for school districts which choose to utilize a non-traditional calendar that may fall below statutory requirements for days in school.

Section 1 allows for local school boards to pursue an alternative calendar that is less than 172 total days in session.

Section 2 adds language which provides the criteria for local school boards to demonstrate to the commissioner in an application for an alternative school calendar. Additionally, an alternate days-of-service chart in which teachers can receive credit toward their retirement and benefits when working on a shortened school calendar under the Department of Administration is included in this section.

The effective date of this act is July 1, 2014.
