BILL NO. HB 28

Analysis

HB 28 would amend AS 21.03.021 to exempt solicitation of an agreement or an agreement between a prospective recipient of ambulance, emergency, or fire protection services and a municipality or community-based nonprofit that provides ambulance, emergency, or fire protection services.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the Division of Insurance from this bill.
