Analysis

CSHB 89(RES) establishes the aquatic invasive species response fund and develops a procedure for responding to and controlling aquatic invasive species.

CSHB 89(RES) has no fiscal impact to the Department of Environmental Conservation, Division of Environmental Health. If passed, additional work requirements that this bill may create would be handled by current division staff as part of our existing working relationship with ADF&G.
