#### Forty-ninth Day

Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Chenault at 10:34 a.m.

Roll call showed 38 members present. Representatives Guttenberg and LeDoux had been excused from a call of the House today.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Tom Heutte, Lay Leader of Juneau Unitarian Universalist Fellowship. Representative P. Wilson moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

With the deepest respect for the religious beliefs of all Alaskans, I offer the following reading from the *Dhammapada*.

*Never does hatred cease by hating in return; only through love can hatred come to an end. Victory breeds hatred; the conquered dwell in sorrow and resentment. They who give up all thought of victory or defeat may be calm and live happily at peace. Let us overcome violence by gentleness. Let us overcome evil by good. Let us overcome the miserly by generosity. Let us overcome the liar by truth.*

President Huggins appointed Representative Kerttula and Senator Ellis to escort the Senator to the joint session.

The Senate Sergeant-at-Arms announced the Senator's entrance into the House Chamber.

Senator Begich was escorted to the rostrum and welcomed by President Huggins.

A question and answer period followed the conclusion of the Senator's speech.

Senator Begich received a standing ovation and was escorted from the Chamber by Representative Kerttula and Senator Ellis.

Senator Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent that the joint session adjourn. There being no objection, President Huggins adjourned the joint session at 12:00 p.m.
