FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The CCS for HB 75 (version PP) amends existing law and creates several new statutes regarding marijuana. In section 4, new AS 17.38.370 requires the Supreme Court to create a bail forfeiture schedule for violations of AS 17.38.030 - .050. These are the sections of law that create violations for exceeding the personal cultivation limits and conditions, consuming marijuana in public, and using false identification at a marijuana establishment. The effect of having these violations on a bail schedule is that those charged with the violations on a citation would be able to pay the fine without a mandatory court appearance.

The Supreme Court can create the marijuana bail forfeiture schedule without additional resources. The court system therefore submits this zero fiscal note.
