FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

Section 21 of the bill amends existing AS 44.29.092, giving an authorized agent or employee of the Department of Health and Social Services the authority to enforce the bill's prohibition on the sale of electronic smoking products or products containing nicotine to a person under 19 years of age.

The Division of Behavioral Health's Tobacco Youth Education and Enforcement Program currently enforces Alaska law prohibiting the sale of various tobacco products to youth. The Department anticipates being able to integrate enforcement of activity involving electronic smoking products and products containing nicotine into current tobacco enforcement practice. No new funds will be required for this activity.
