2018 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

House Bill 2 would provide assistance to veterans seeking employment by allowing private employers to voluntarily establish veteran hiring preferences. As this bill relates primarily to private employers, it will have no impact on the employees and services provided by the Department. We expect no increase in personnel paperwork associated with the passage of this bill, and since processing of transfers, deployments, etc. is within the Department's everyday operations, this bill will have zero fiscal impact on the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs.
