FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

2018 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis****Section 1**

This is a new section requiring the agency or procurement officer to submit current or prospective employees' or contractors' fingerprints to the department for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation to obtain a national criminal history record check.

This added step in the procurement process would be absorbed into the existing and ongoing work of the unit and would not result in additional administrative costs. The collection of fees associated with the background check can be absorbed by existing revenue authorization existing in the budget.

Section 2

The amendment to this section is applicable only to procurement processes requiring a background investigation for contractors with access to federal tax information. The amended language requires the procurement officer to notify current or prospective contractors to submit to and pass a background investigation that includes a state and national criminal history record check. This added step in the procurement process can be absorbed by existing staff without any increase in costs.

Section 3

This section adds a new chapter, 55, that applies to the State Personnel Procedures. The department has procedures in place regarding background investigations for employees. There is no fiscal impact to the Departmental Support Services division resulting from this addition.
