FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2018 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation establishes procedures to safeguard the confidentiality of federal tax information. Five staff in the department's Unemployment Insurance program will have access to federal tax information as a result of Treasury Offset Program implementation. Each staff member involved will be required to undergo a criminal history background check and fingerprinting.

The anticipated cost, estimated at \$47 per employee, will be covered within the current budget by the federal Unemployment Insurance administrative grant.
