Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Edgmon at 11:05 a.m.

Roll call showed 38 members present. Representative Kreiss-Tomkins was absent and his presence was noted later.

Representative Tuck moved and asked unanimous consent that Representative Fansler be excused from a call of the House today until 1:00 p.m. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative Gara. Representative Westlake moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

Representative Eastman moved and asked unanimous consent that Amendment No. 1 be adopted.

There was objection.

Representative Eastman moved and asked unanimous consent to withdraw Amendment No. 1. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

Amendment No. 2 was offered by Representatives Kopp, Eastman, Saddler, and Rauscher:

Page 1, line 11:

Delete "the charges" Insert "all charges"

Page 1, line 11, following "dismissed":

Insert "and were not dismissed as part of a plea agreement in another criminal case under Rule 11, Alaska Rules of Criminal Procedure"

Representative Kopp moved and asked unanimous consent that Amendment No. 2 be adopted.

Representative Kawasaki objected and withdrew the objection. There being no further objection, Amendment No. 2 was adopted.
