Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Edgmon at 11:04 a.m.

Roll call showed 32 members present. Representative Thompson had been excused from a call of the House today.

Representative Tuck moved and asked unanimous consent that Representatives Drummond, Knopp, Kreiss-Tomkins, Pruitt, Rauscher, Sullivan-Leonard, and Wool be excused from a call of the House today. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative Kopp. Representative Westlake moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
