Roll call showed 37 members present. Representatives Chenault and Thompson had been excused from a call of the House today. Representative Drummond was absent and her presence was noted later.

SENSE OF THE HOUSE

The following Sense of the House was offered by Representative Eastman:

"It is the sense of the House that Alaska should join the states of Texas, Alabama, Arkansas, Louisiana, Nebraska, South Carolina and West Virginia in the multi-state coalition lawsuit filed yesterday to protect the rule of law and end the unconstitutional Obama-era Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) Program, which granted lawful presence and work permits to nearly one million unlawfully present aliens without congressional approval.

The Constitution guarantees the American people the right to set their own immigration policies through their representatives in Congress. The federal executive branch lacks the power to unilaterally grant unlawfully present aliens lawful presence and work authorization. Left intact, DACA sets a dangerous precedent by giving the executive branch sweeping authority to ignore the laws enacted by Congress and change our nation's immigration laws to suit a president's own preferences.

The danger DACA poses goes far beyond the consequences it poses for our nation's immigration system. It invites future presidents to ignore the law, ignore the will of the people, and set their own policies on the 2nd Amendment, privacy rights, drug laws, or any other important issue debated in Congress. Left unchallenged, DACA will encourage lawlessness within the federal government and at our borders."

Representative Eastman moved that the Sense of the House be adopted.
