## Thirty-seventh Day

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Kelly at 11:09 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. The seat from District E was vacant.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Michelle Hale, Council Member of the Juneau Shambhala Center. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Four attitudes common across many Buddhist traditions are what are known as the Four Immeasurables. First, May all beings enjoy happiness and the root of happiness. The root of happiness can be known as "nothing to hold onto." Second, May all beings be free from suffering and the root of suffering. You guessed it. The root of suffering is something to hold onto. All of those things that we hold onto: Physical, emotional, grudges, things we like. The third Immeasurable is, May all beings not be separated from the great happiness, devoid of suffering. In other words, may all beings be joyful. And finally, May they dwell in the great equanimity, or peace, free from grasping, pushing away, and not caring. May you all enjoy a happy and joyful day.
